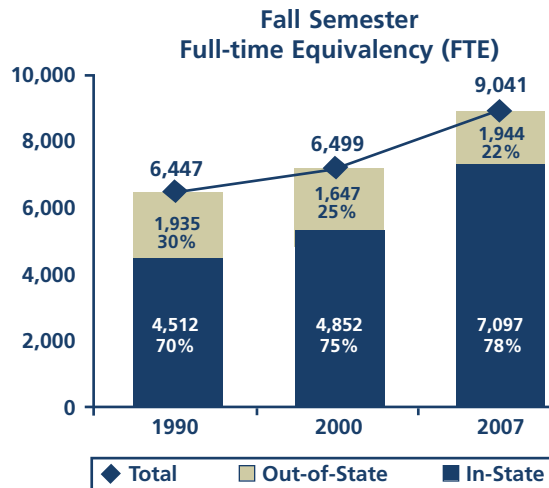
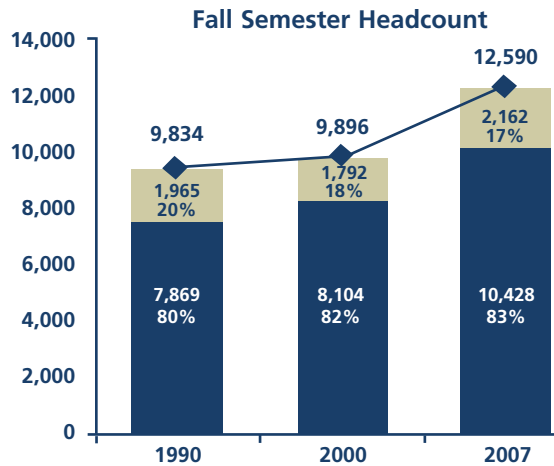

VSC Economic Impact

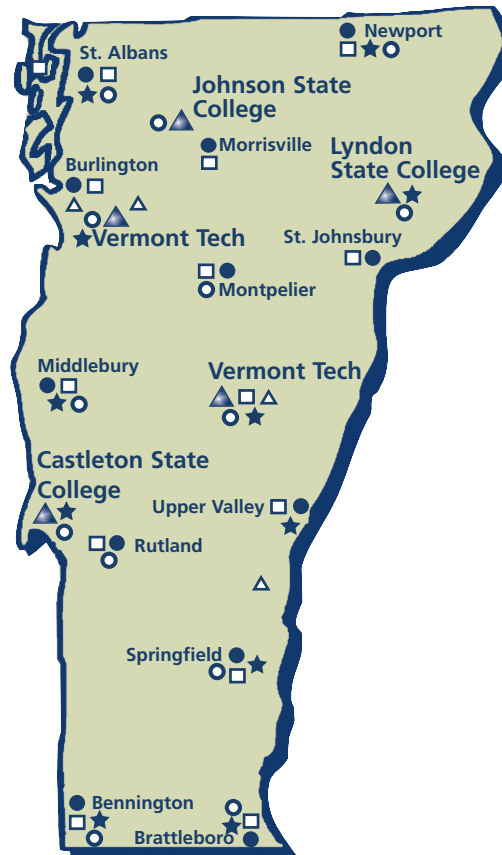
