# Special Programs

## For Adults

**Assessment of Prior Learning (APL)** gives college credit for students' college-level learning acquired through work, community experience, self-study or other non-college experiences. Over 7000 Vermonters have taken part in the program; over 95% earn a college degree.

**The Johnson State College External Degree Program (EDP)** helps adult learners with at least 60 credits complete their bachelor's degree largely in their own community through a flexible combination of courses offered on weekends, online and in the evenings.

## For High School Students

**Introduction to College Studies** helps students develop strategies for college success. The **Dual Enrollment** and **Fast Forward** programs allow high school and technical center students to earn college credit while still in high school. The **Vermont Academy of Science and Technology (VAST)** offers a full-year alternative to the senior year of high school, allowing students to complete their last year of high school and their freshman year of college simultaneously.

## For Business & Industry

**Vermont Corporate College** helps Vermont businesses meet their workforce and professional development needs, and improve their overall competitiveness and economic performance through a strong combination of regional access, statewide delivery, and career-oriented content statewide.

**The Vermont Manufacturing Extension Center (VMEC)** is a not-for-profit center that provides assistance and training to help manufacturers improve their manufacturing and business processes, adopt advanced technologies, increase productivity, reduce costs and improve competitiveness.

**The Vermont Small Business Development Center (SBDC)** is a non-profit partnership of government, education, and business whose mission is to strengthen existing business entities and assist start-ups with high-quality, no-cost counseling and affordable training programs.

**The VTC Technology Extension Division (TED)** designs and delivers workforce education and training for and to employers and individuals throughout Vermont.

**Vermont Interactive Television** is Vermont's premier video-conferencing and distance learning system, with 15 locations statewide.

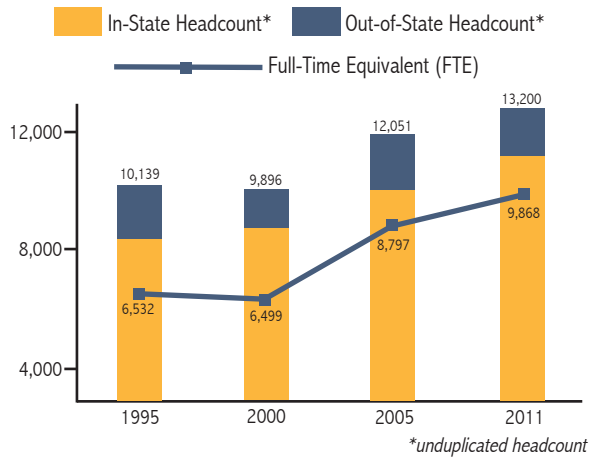

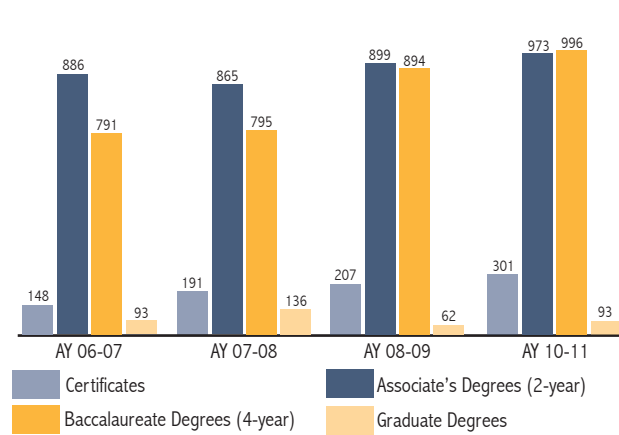

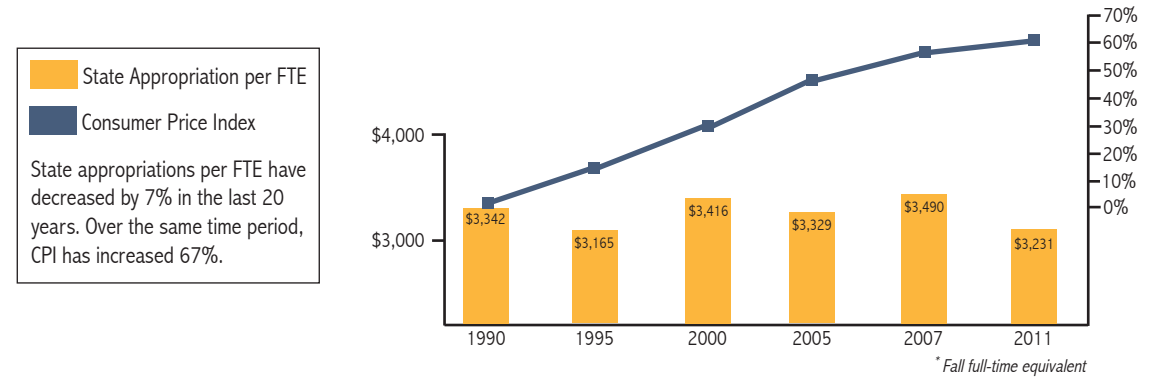
## VSC Fall Enrollment



## Degrees Awarded Annually

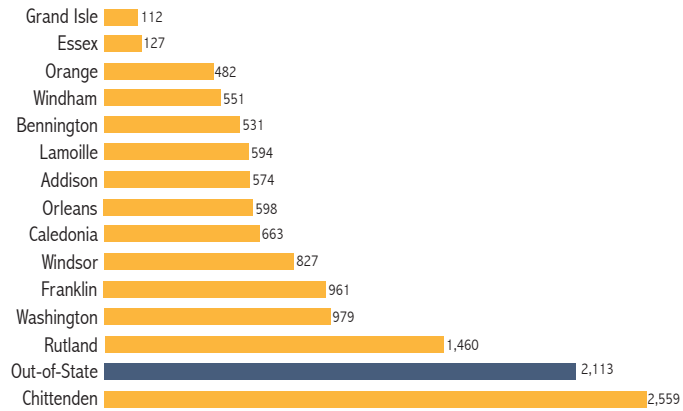


## State Appropriation per FTE Vermonter\*



**In 2011, Vermont ranked 49th in state appropriations per \$1000 personal income.**

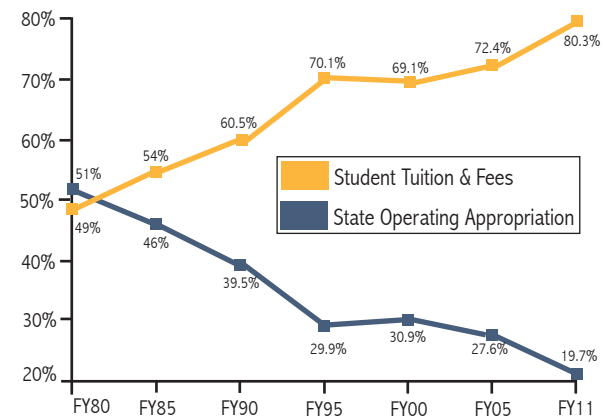
## VSC Headcount Enrollment by County of Residence, Fall 2011
