

## DEGREE MAP AND MILESTONES.

### History Degree Map 2025-2026

Notes: This is a suggested pathway.

1. The 1000-level core His courses are offered each semester.
2. In Year 1 and Fall of Year 2, aim to complete the 1000-level core courses and possibly one or more 2000-level courses. These form the foundation for 3000-level courses.
3. 2000- and 3000- HIS electives: take 18 credits, nine of which must be at the 3000 level and nine of which must be non-U.S./ Europe (a 3000-level HIS course in Asian history would fulfill two requirements, for example).
4. The only HIS courses with pre-requisites are HIS 4601 and HIS 4602, so other core courses and electives may be taken at any time.
5. The History capstone sequence, HIS 4601 and HIS 4602, should be taken in your senior year. You should take at least one 3000-level History course before enrolling in the capstone.

In the following degree map, rows named as xxx xxxx could be applied to further history courses (beyond requirements), a second major or one or more minors or certificate programs.

We encourage students to study away for at least one semester. Contact the History coordinator to discuss how to fulfill requirements and electives while studying away.

#### MILESTONES:

Courses are numbered to support scaffolding of the major. The only requirements relate to the capstone sequence.

1. HIS 4601 History Research Seminar and HIS 4602 History Thesis Seminar are restricted to history majors.
2. HIS 4601 History Research Seminar has a prerequisite of 60 credits or Junior standing.
3. Passing HIS 4601 is a prerequisite to enrolling in HIS 4602 History Thesis Seminar.
